KEEPING ADVENT, CHRISTMAS, AND OUR BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Our tradition at Good Shepherd is to fully observe the season of Advent. We do this intentionally so we can be in one place that honors holy waiting. We have many beautiful and meaningful Advent hymns to sing. We have deeply hopeful scriptures and prayers to share. We have beautiful blue paraments, vestments and advent wreath candles that remind us of the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose color is blue. We too, with her, await new birth and new life for ourselves and for the world. It is a good thing to prepare spiritually for the deeply spiritual event of the incarnation of God's chosen one, the bringer of salvation for the whole world.

When Christmas finally arrives, we celebrate with music, light, and beauty. Special services bring us together for the special arrival of the Good News of God with us. We attend because we honor holy celebrating. This year we have the opportunity to reflect further on the meaning of God's presence in our midst as a child with two Sundays after Christmas. Usually we get one. When our culture has put away lights and carols and announces drastic price reductions, we continue to keep Christmas and ponder with Mary all these things that have come to pass through heartfelt worship. There are more carols to sing, more scriptures to hear, more time to take in and digest the presence of God among us, and what that means for us.

As a way to mark the beginning of our new year on the church liturgical calendar, we also return to our beginnings in the life of faith: our baptism. All during Advent, we promise each week (in the words of the baptismal covenant):

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

Our aim in repeating this promise is to get it into our mouths and into our hearts and into our living. This is not just some random exercise to fill up some unused space in our worship, but getting back to our roots and convictions and ultimate reasons for being part of a Christian community in a troubled and troubling world. We honor holy promise making. Praying together the <u>Litany for Justice and Peace in all the Earth</u> reminds us of our calling and helps us to set our priorities according to God's design, not our own. What are we here for as a congregation, as a community of the baptized, as people named by God and called into service? May our keeping of Advent, Christmas and our Baptismal Covenant remind us of these good things.
